Dear Zwingli Family,

Wherever this finds you, I hope and pray all is well with you as the month of October ends and November begins. We've got a lot going on this month at Zwingli, and I am going to highlight those in this letter.



### IN-PERSON WORSHIP INSTRUCTIONS

The Return to Church (RTC) team continues to require masking indoors *for all* who attend services or use our buildings. We also ask those attending on Sunday mornings to speak and sing softly during worship services.

Continuing with a policy requiring masks is a very difficult decision. We are acting in this way due to the high level of COVID-19 cases, the aggressive or unknown behavior of variants, and information gleaned from Montgomery County and the CDC. The team is especially concerned for youth and children who have not been or are not able to be vaccinated.

We will continue to monitor pertinent information as we always have and make ongoing decisions about restrictions as new information is available. We ask for your patience and hope our church community can be flexible enough to move in and out of restrictions with ease, if necessary, as we keep in mind the safety of our congregation and the community at large.

We continue to ask for your help in protecting our entire congregation by staying home if you feel sick or are experiencing any of the following:

- Any symptoms of Covid-19 cough, fever, loss of smell and/or taste, headache, or shortness of breath.
- Have cared for or been in close contact with anyone diagnosed with Covid-19 in the past 14 days. (Please note that this does not apply to health care professionals.)
- Have been advised to self-quarantine.
- Are currently infected with Covid-19 or are undergoing treatment for Covid-19.

Healthy Moments
Tis the Season for Women's Health
Detecting Cervical Cancer

"Beloved, I pray that all may go well with you and that you may be in good health, as it goes well with your soul. "3 John1:2

The focus of last month's article was on breast awareness. This month we continue to expand on women's health by addressing the need to monitor for cervical cancer. The cervix is the lower, narrow end of the uterus. Cervical cancer is the easiest gynecologic cancer to prevent with regular screening tests and follow up. It is also highly curable when found and treated early.

All women are at risk for cervical cancer. It occurs most often in women over age 30. Each year, approximately 12,000 women in the United States develop cervical cancer. The human papillomavirus (HPV) is the main cause of cervical cancer. HPV is a common virus that is passed from one person to another through sexual contact.

Early on, cervical cancer may not cause signs and symptoms. Advanced cervical cancer may cause bleeding or discharge from the vagina that is not normal for the individual. If any of these symptoms occur, it is important to contact your physician for follow-up.

The Pap test is one of the most reliable and effective cancer screening tests available. Women between ages 21-29 years should see their physician and undergo a Pap test every three years. Women within the age group of 30-65 years are urges to get a Pap test every three years, HPV testing every five years or a combination of these two tests every five years. For women 21-65, it is important to continue getting a Pap test and/or HPV test as requested by the physician. The testing needs to be continued even if it is anticipated there will be no more pregnancies and/or sexual activity.

Exceptions to these guidelines for obtaining a Pap test would be if a female is over 65 and has had a normal Pap or HPV test for several years. The other exception is if the cervix has been removed as part of a total hysterectomy for non-cancerous conditions (fibroids).

The risk of developing cervical cancer is increased with the presence of the HPV virus. Almost all cervical cancers are caused by HPV. The risk of developing HPV is greater if sexual activity began at an early age or if there have been multiple sexual partners. There are many types of HPV and most will go away with minimal treatment. But when the HPV persists and will not go away, it can cause cervical cancer. Other factors increasing the risk for cervical cancer include smoking, having HIV (virus causing AIDS), using birth control pills for extended period of time (five or more years), and having given birth to three or more children.

To prevent cervical cancer, see your doctor regularly for a Pap and/or HPV test. Follow up with your physician if your cervical cancer screening is abnormal. Get the HPV vaccine. It protects against the types of HPV that most often cause cervical cancer. It is recommended for

preteens (both boys and girls) aged 11-12 years, but can be administered up to age 26. The vaccine is given in a series of either two or three injections. Even with having the vaccine, women need to have regular Pap tests to screen for cervical cancer.

Last month the challenging question was asking where you were with your breast awareness screening. This month, the question is to ask if you are up to date on your cervical cancer screening? When was your last Pap test or HPV test completed? If you are current, pat yourself on the back and continue to be compliant with cervical cancer screening. If not, please add to your list of things to do and make it a priority. Early detection is usually a curable situation. Waiting for symptoms to appear could become a long-term health journey with troublesome outcomes. For your own peace of mind, make sure all is good!!!




### 2021 STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN ROOTED IN LOVE

The Ministry of Stewardship is very grateful for the abundent and generous giving of Zwingli members.

Starting on Sunday, November 28, Youth Group will be studying the book, *The Redemption of Scrooge*. Books will be provided for the youth!




### ADULT BIBLE STUDY

### **ADVENT MISSION PROJECT**

This year's project benefits CHOP Primary Care offices through the Reach Out & Read program. The local Souderton CHOP PC office has moved to their new location at 4 S. County Line Rd., previously Biggies. The Reach Out and Read program provides new developmentally appropriate books to take home for each child from 6 months to 5 years old who visits a CHOP office. The material used for the covers of books for the younger children is also taken into consideration because it generally ends up in their mouths at some

point. Consequently Reach Out & Read only accepts financial donations in order to purchase the books from preferred sources. Each book costs \$2.75. So 10 books cost \$27.50, 100 books \$275, etc. NOTE: Prior to COVID they accepted new or gently used books for their waiting rooms, but stopped that practice for now. In each exam room the doctor and Nurse Practitioner (NP) teaches parents the importance of reading aloud to their young children every day based on research showing that the first 1,000 days of a child's life are the most critical in terms of brain development. The pediatricians and NPs offer age-appropriate tips and encouragement which has proven that when they promote literacy readiness according to the Reach Out and Read model the following occurs:

- Parents are two and a half times more likely to read to their children.
- Parents are two times more likely to read to their children more than three times a week.
- Families are two and a half times more likely to enjoy reading together or have books in the home.
- Children's language development is improved by three to six months.
- Children's language ability improves with increased exposure to Reach Out and Read.

Please consider supporting this year's Advent mission project with a donation that allows the purchase of 10 books or 100 books. However any amount donated will be greatly appreciated. Let's help young families give their children a head start in life.
