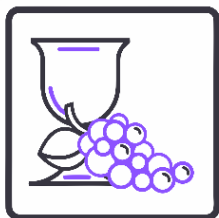

CHURCH FINANCIAL STATUS AS OF MAY 30, 2023

As illustrated in the graph, below, Zwingli is significantly behind in income vs. expenses. The deficit is \$52,464 which is \$9,904 more than the deficit at same time last year. These numbers represent offerings and income that can be used to cover budgeted operating expenses. For example, this does not include memorial gifts, gifts to special mission projects (such as the youth mission trip), and income/expenditures from accounts like the Mildred Mitchell General or Music accounts. Please prayerfully consider increasing your giving for the remainder of the year so that Zwingli can end the year on a neutral or positive balance. Thank you!



NEW ACCESS TO GIVING!

Most of you are aware of the “Donate” button on Zwingli’s web site. That takes you to the church’s PayPal account where you can electronically provide your offerings. Now, you can do it straight from the Sunday worship bulletin. The PayPal Quick Response (QR) code is pictured below. Unlike the “Donate” button on the web site, you’ll have to have a PayPal account and the PayPal app on your cell phone to use this QR code. Use your phone’s camera or a QR scanning app, get the QR code in view of the camera and it will open up your PayPal app and allow you to transfer your offering to Zwingli. If you wish to designate some or all of the offering to something other than the General Fund account, you can add that direction into the “notes section”. If you don’t have a PayPal account, you can still go to the church’s web site and hit the “Donate” button. You can also continue to put your offering in the plate, mail it to the office, or use direct deposit. Any questions?  **Keystone Opportunity Center** 

To help ensure that everyone has a happy and nutritious summer, Keystone Opportunity Center is once again hosting their *Kids* Summer Food Bag Program.

In May, the KOC food pantry served families that included over 220 kids.

That is 43% more than this time last year! To help meet the needs of pantry families, over 700 bags of kid-friendly food are needed between June and August.

A letter with more detail from KOC is posted on the Missioner's' bulletin board. The envelopes on the tree will contain a list of items needed for each food bag and the times and location for drop off. Completed bags can also be brought to the church and placed in the coat room.

 **Indian Valley Public Library** 

The Indian Valley Public Library (IVPL) serves five of the communities within the Souderton Area School District – Franconia, Lower Salford, Salford, Souderton, and Telford.

IVPL is an accessible and accommodating space where people from all walks of life can gather. The Library reflects our Indian Valley, serving as an extension of each municipality, providing

resources and opportunities otherwise unavailable to many of our region's citizens and doing so free of charge.

We value the positive impact our public library has on our children. We value literacy and promoting a love of reading. We value respect for each individual person and recognize the need to serve all members of our public. We value community and the potential for our library to strengthen our democracy by inviting civic engagement and civil discussions.

Our funding has been decreased this year and there are some who are talking about further cuts as well as book bans, etc. which we believe is a small but powerful politically motivated group. You can help us weather this storm with your donation to IVPL.

Every two years, General Synod brings together thousands of faithful members of the United Church of Christ for formal church witness, inspirational worship, and fellowship with friends (new and old). This year the General Synod 2023 will take place in Indianapolis, IN on June 30 – July 4th, 2023. Pastor Alan will be representing Zwingli United church of Christ.

The United Church of Christ is planning to create menstrual hygiene kits or “period packs” as a General Synod 34 mission project with Church World Service to address menstrual justice as the wider church.

The UCC and CWS hope to collect and assemble kits at General Synod at the Indiana Convention Center, with a goal of amassing 1,000 period packs by July 4.

Tick Bite: What to Do

If you bite and devour each other, watch out or you will be destroyed by each other.

Galations 5:15

Summer has arrived and along with it the Tick season. Pennsylvania is listed as one of the most prevalent states to harbor tick infestations which cause Lyme Disease. The CDC (Center for Disease Control) reports 134,624 confirmed cases of Lyme disease in the state of Pennsylvania per 2020 data. Pennsylvania has led the nation for confirmed Lyme Disease due to a tick bite for 11 of the last 12 years. It is suspected that global warming may be contributing to increasing the population of the tick infestations. It is predicted that Pennsylvania will get warmer and wetter as a result of climate change, and ticks thrive in these conditions. A factor supporting the tick infestation is the host species such as deer and white-footed mice, both of which are plentiful in Pennsylvania. Many people may think that the most likely place to encounter ticks is in a state park or the woods. The reality is that the most common exposure is in the backyard.

Avoidance and protection are key to avoiding a tick bite:

1. Before going outside, know where to expect ticks. Ticks live in grass, brush, or wooded, areas, or on animals. Spending time outside could put you in contact with a tick.

2. Protect yourself and family by using an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) registered insect repellent. When used as directed, the EPA registered insect repellents are proven safe and effective.
3. Wear long sleeved shirts and long pants. Dress your child in clothing that covers arms and legs. Cover strollers and baby carriers with mosquito netting.

After you return indoors:

1. Check your clothing for ticks as they can attach to clothing and then crawl on skin.
2. Check your body for ticks. Conduct a full body check, looking in the hair, around the ears, under the arms, navel (belly button), around the waist, between the legs, and behind the knees.
3. Shower soon after being outdoors.

Tick bites can make people sick. If you are identifying a tick bite, follow the steps listed below to reduce your chance of getting sick.

1. Remove the tick as soon as possible.
 - a. Use fine tipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to the skin as you can. Pull upward with steady, even pressure. Do not twist or jerk.
 - b. After removing the tick, clean the bite area and your hands with rubbing alcohol or soap and water.
 - c. Dispose of the tick by flushing it down the toilet. If you want to take the tick to your family provider for identification, put it in rubbing alcohol or place it in a sealed bag or container.
2. Contact your provider if the tick was attached under the skin and drew blood
3. Watch for symptoms for 30 days
 - a. Call your healthcare provider if you develop a rash, fever, fatigue, headache, muscle pain, or joint swelling and pain.

b. Treatment for tick borne diseases should be based on symptoms, history of exposure to ticks, and in some cases, blood test results. Most tickborne diseases can be treated with a short course of antibiotics.

Common questions after a tick bite:

1. Can a person get sick from a tick that is crawling on your body but has not yet attached? Ticks must bite you to spread germs. Once the tick attaches to the body, it will feed on the blood and can spread germs. A tick that is crawling but is not attached cannot spread germs.
2. How long does a tick need to be attached before it can spread infection? In most cases, a tick must be attached for 36-48 hours or more before the Lyme Disease bacterium can be transmitted. If a tick is removed within 24 hours, it will greatly reduce the chances of getting Lyme Disease. The risk for Lyme Disease is very low if a tick has been attached for fewer than 24 hours. Check for ticks daily and remove them as soon as possible. Lyme Disease can be prevented by avoiding tick bites and promptly removing ticks. Have a safe summer and stay tick free!

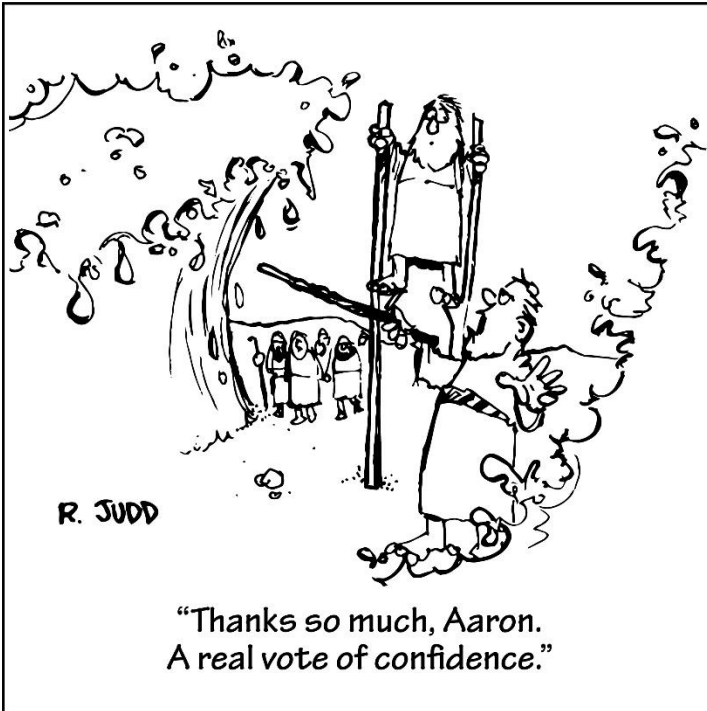

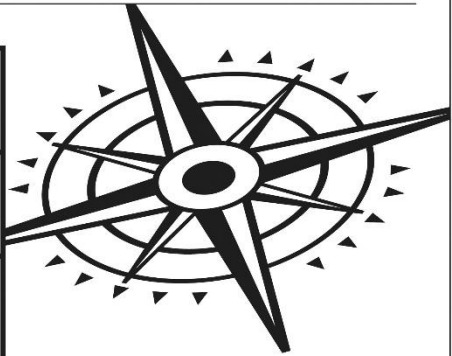
