Dear Zwingli Church,

When I was six or seven-years old, I remember spending what seemed like hours lying by the Christmas tree in anticipation of Christmas Day and the opening of presents. I recollect the glistening lights on the tree, the smell of the evergreen tree — before we got an artificial one. We didn't celebrate Advent in the Southern Baptist Church of my youth. I didn't really know what the season of Advent was or what it meant until I reached my mid-20's while attending a UCC church for the first time, but I did know a little bit about waiting.

We all know what it feels like to wait for something, especially for events or things we feel are important: waiting for members to say yes to serving in a leadership position; waiting for the birth of a child; waiting in those last weeks or days by the bedside of a loved one that is dying; waiting for the building to be built (remember that?); waiting for an anticipated event, like graduation, a birthday, a special concert, or vacation; waiting for a bus, train, or airplane; waiting for something to cook, to boil (a watched pot never boils!); waiting for family to arrive; waiting for the answer to prayer; waiting for peace to reign. All these examples involve waiting, but each kind of waiting is of a different quality and teach different lessons.

Advent is known to be the season of waiting...and preparation. But waiting for what? The word Advent is taken from the Latin word *adventus*, which means coming or arrival. Traditionally, Advent focuses on the past, the coming of the Christ Child, and the future, the 2nd coming of Christ. We also see Advent as preparing for the coming of Christ right now into our hearts, our worship, our faith journey, our lives. Yet, in our culture, where technology speeds up expectations, waiting has become a little old-fashioned. We can barely wait a few seconds or minutes anymore for a social media response, or website to load, or tv program to appear on our smart tv. We've lost that sense of what it truly means to wait and anticipate.

However, I believe that waiting is a spiritual exercise that strengthens our faith. If we pay attention, waiting, along with preparation, can strengthen our faith in amazing ways. Mary's faith was one of the reasons she was chosen to bear the Christchild. Yet, she didn't simply laze around and do nothing while awaiting Christ's birth. Though the Bible isn't full of many stories about that time of waiting, many a mother could fill us in on what it means to carry life inside their body and how waiting is filled with joy and exhaustion, excitement and fear, pain and exhilaration, and many a lesson. However, there are some great stories, especially in Luke, about Elizabeth and Zachariah and Mary in that time of waiting. Read those stories closely and you will see lessons about faith, denial, fear (or "Do not be afraid"), rejoicing, preparation, God doing the impossible, God's care for the marginalized, and so many more. At one point in the story Mary utters the words that we all hope to reflect in our own lives – My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior...."

SO, in this Advent, I hope that you will spend time learning about waiting and what it means to prepare your hearts for the Lord's coming, and how to let your soul magnify the Lord. It's part of our tradition and our present. Waiting, and the preparation that goes

along with it will teach valuable faith lessons. Strive to learn them. And if you need a little inspiration, read the birth narratives in Luke, or other scripture devoted to the Advent season.

May your Advent and Christmas seasons be blessed!

December is *Olive Kitteridge*: Fiction by Elizabeth Strout. Family

discussed this program year. Below is the description for this
month's discussion.

Olive Kitteridge: Fiction – In a voice more powerful and compassionate than ever before, New York Times bestselling author Elizabeth Strout binds together thirteen rich, luminous narratives into a book with the heft of a novel, through the presence of one larger-than-life, unforgettable character: Olive Kitteridge. At the edge of the continent, Crosby, Maine, may seem like nowhere, but seen through this brilliant writer's eyes, it is in essence the whole world, and the lives that are lived there are filled with all of the grand human drama-desire, despair, jealousy, hope, and love. At times stern, at other times patient, at times perceptive, at other times in sad denial, Olive Kitteridge, a retired schoolteacher, deplores the changes in her little town and in the world at large, but she doesn't always recognize the changes in those around her: a lounge musician haunted by a past romance: a former student who has lost the will to live: Olive's own adult child, who feels tyrannized by her irrational sensitivities; and Henry, who finds his loyalty to his marriage both a blessing and a curse. As the townspeople grapple with their problems, mild and dire, Olive is brought to a deeper understanding of herself and her life-sometimes painfully, but always with ruthless honesty. Olive Kitteridge offers profound insights into the human condition-its conflicts, its tragedies and joys, and the endurance it requires.



Healthy Moment Avoiding Weight Gain Over the Holidays Kristie Lowery, Congregational Health Nurse

"13 No testing has overtaken you that is not common to everyone. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tested beyond your strength, but with the testing he will also provide the way out so that you may be able to endure it. "1 Corinthians 10:13

The holidays are fast approaching and along with that, many holiday meals, gatherings, and parties. One of the biggest complaints around the holiday meals and parties is often heard as "I ate too much", or "I can't eat another thing." Recent research identified that nearly 75% of Americans admit to gaining weight over the holidays and many do not lose the weight afterwards. How can you stop this hamster wheel that keeps us battling the food and weight gain dilemma? An article written by Zindzy Gracia lists some healthy tips for eating during the holidays.

- 1. Avoid going to a holiday dinner starving. If you are hungry, you are most likely to overeat. Eat a light snack beforehand so you are not tempted to binge.
- 2. Fill your plate with veggies first. Vegetables are low in calories and high in fiber, which will help to fill you up without putting on pounds. Try to fill half of your plate with veggies and a smaller portion of the main dish and sides.

- 3. Limit your portion sizes. Practice moderation. Fill your plate with a small amount of each food and save room for dessert. Keep starchy veggies to a minimum, as they are higher in calories.
- 4. Go for lighter appetizers. Choose ones that are baked or grilled. Or just skip the appetizers and save the calories for other parts of the meal.
- 5. Avoid traditional recipes when possible. Go for recipes that are lower in fat, calories, and healthy ingredients.
- 6. Drink water. Staying hydrated will help you feel full and prevent you from overeating. Be sure to drink plenty of water throughout the day, both before and after your meal.
- 7. Avoid alcohol. Alcohol can affect interfere with your resistance to avoid overeating. It is also high in calories. Avoiding alcohol helps to motivate you to stay healthy. If one does decide to drink, moderation is the best policy.
- 8. Don't drink your calories. Many people do not realize how many calories are in their favorite holiday drinks. Eggnog can have over 500 calories per cup. If you are watching your weight, skip the festive beverages and stick to water.
- 9. Don't eat until you are stuffed. Pay attention to your body's cues and stop eating when you are no longer hungry. It takes 20 minutes for your brain to register that you are full. Slow down and savor your meal. After clearing your plate, wait a few minutes before getting seconds.
- 10. If you are not hosting, bring a healthy dish to share. Check with the hostess first, but if there is agreement it will assure that there is at least one healthy option available. Some ideal dishes include salads, roasted vegetable, or whole grain side dishes.

11. Get moving! Exercise is a great way to offset any weight gain from your holiday feast. Make sure to get moving as soon as you can to burn up the additional calories consumed.

The holiday is a time to enjoy family, friends, and good food. But it does not need to be an unhealthy holiday. You can make healthier choices and avoid overeating. If you do overeat, get right back on track with healthy eating and exercise the following day.


